Legislation provides rules for the safe maintenance, operation and inspection of lifting machines across North America. Accredited operators are needed to operate and run articulated cranes under 16,000 lbs. capacity. The articulated crane driver has to have knowledge concerning the various operational characteristics and features of the machinery. Prior to use, a pre-operational equipment check needs to be performed. There is a legal requirement to carry out a pre-operational check and a check of the worksite ground and overhead conditions.

The guidelines provided in the manufacturer manual gives information on maintenance, inspection, and loading and unloading operations. According to legislation, annual and daily checks are mandatory. Operators have to maintain an up-to-date logbook in most places. They might be required to validate equipment warranties.

Adding remote control devices to the cranes is usually suggested. Remote control improves safety by allowing the driver an easier alternative for handling the crane.

Prioritizing crane safety helps a company's bottom line. Companies which follow safe machine practices normally enjoy bigger cost savings compared to those which don't. The chance of equipment damage and personal injury is greatly reduced if a driver who is well-trained is handling the crane. Safety conscious drivers are much more productive leading to less times needed for loading and unloading.
