Operators of heavy equipment will be needed to be certified by their regional or local agency. A lot of these operators are cross-trained and certified to operate a lot of different models of heavy equipment. Others choose to specialize in operating just one type of machine and just require periodic updates on their operating permit certifications.

The employers working in this business operating heavy machines would normally be trained by taking a formal apprenticeship program or by receiving on-the-job training by their unions or companies. It is necessary that employers hire fully-trained heavy equipment operators to adhere to local rules and adhere to local and regional laws regarding job conditions and worker safety.
